

Bait-bucket and Livewell Holding of

Black Salty

- 1) You must have a well-aerated holding bucket.
- 2) Use baitshop holding water when purchasing fish.
- 3) Water in holding system **must be freshwater**.
- 4) **Chlorine/Chloramine** must be removed from municipal water supplies with a Chlorine/Chloramine remover (these types of products are available from any store carrying aquarium supplies).
- 5) Holding fish depends primarily on water temperature. The hotter the water the fewer fish that can be held in that water. Follow the table below as a general guideline when holding water is less than 85 degrees Fahrenheit.

Holding container	Number of Fish
1 gallon plastic bag with O2 tablet	1 dozen
Aerated 1-gallon bait bucket	1 dozen
Aerated 5-gallon bait bucket	4 dozen
Aerated livewell, per every 5 gallons	4 dozen

- 6) After fish are in holding container, chilling of fish may be accomplished by adding ice. **Add only 1 cup of ice per gallon of holding water at a time.** Wait until completely melted before adding additional ice. Repeat as necessary throughout day to maintain a cool water temperature.

Fish Tips

- 1 drop of hydrogen peroxide per 5 gallons of water will remove chlorine.
- Water in a bucket left overnight (i.e., 24 hours) will lose all of its chlorine.
- Change water every day when holding fish for several days.
- **DO NOT** feed your fish. This will only foul your water faster.
